Oppi — Helsinki Learning Festival has just announced the complete line-up and it has some impressive additions!

The i.am.angel Foundation, founded by Will.i.am from the Black Eyed Peas, are delighted to be presenting their groundbreaking work at Oppi. In the final session called Angels, Astronauts and Robots Lilly Kam from the foundation will discuss the meaning of learning and education alongside with a NASA astronaut through a video link from outer space. Whilst the global superstar Will.i.am brings a certain wow factor, Lilly Kam also wants to emphasise the input of other participants:

The line-up of 90 speakers from 18 countries also includes international experts such as Sarah Brown (A World at School), Naomi Williams (Plan International), John Martin (Sanoma Learning), Tony Wagner ('Finland Phenomenon'), and Jennifer Chung ('Investigation of Reasons for Finland's Success in PISA'), as well as Finnish experts Krista Kiuru (Minister of Education and Science), Pasi Sahlberg (Visiting Professor at Harvard), Esko Aho (Former Prime Minister and Senior Fellow at Harvard), and Saku Tuominen (Idealist Group).

Oppi is a not-for-profit event in which the whole line-up is participating pro-bono, solely for their own interest towards the field of education and wish to share their experiences with others. The main themes of Oppi are new ways of learning, the most recent educational innovations, and design, games, fun, and technology as resources for learning.

Next week will be a huge celebration of learning in Finland. Oppi, the ITK conference and the OAJ event are all excellent reasons why everyone interested in education should come together and celebrate our success.
